



"Cleaning urban villages for Swachh Bharat"

(Collective inputs of 250,000+ Citizens in Swachh Bharat Circle)

- 1. Awareness campaigns on cleanliness should be organised in villages
- 2. The Sarpanch should be made responsible for enforcing cleanliness in his village
- 3. People could team up with NGOs to train the villagers on waste disposal
- 4. Swachh Bharat volunteers in cities could make teams to visit the nearby villages on weekends for cleaning activities and encourage the villagers to do it too
- 5. Items like gloves, dustbins etc. could be donated to villages
- 6. Government and local bodies in villages should insist on sorted waste collection and also educate people about it
- 7. Competition for the 'cleanest village' could be organized amongst a cluster of villages to encourage people to keep their surroundings clean
- 8. Swachh Bharat Mission could create a structure through which people could volunteer to go to nearby village schools to give cleanliness lessons to children
- 9. MPs/MLAs, Corporates and famous personalities could adopt villages and lead a sustained cleanliness initiative there
- 10. An area should be designated in every urban village where wet waste like vegetables, fruits, eatables etc. can be collected to generate compost
- 11. People should be educated not to wash clothes or utensils in river or lake waters
- 12. Awareness on Open Defecation health hazards should be created and efforts should be made to reduce its social acceptability
- 13. NGOs like Sulabh could be partnered with to open public toilets in villages
- 14. The panchayat should be asked to oversee the construction of public toilets in villages
